



# 2020 Street Rehabilitation Project

General Update

September 4, 2020

## Watermain Replacement:

The Contractor will complete Longfellow Street water service reinstatements the week of September 7<sup>th</sup>. Work includes transitioning residents from the temporary water system to the new watermain. This will close out the utility work for the project and the main focus will be grading, select curb replacement, paving and restoration.

## Street Grading:

The Contractor will focus grading efforts on Liberty Street, Longfellow Street, Ruth Street, 79<sup>th</sup> Way and the portions of Ashton Avenue & Ely Street that were not paved last week. As a reminder, we ask that no vehicles be parked on the streets during working hours. This gives the Contractor room to work more efficiently.

## Street Paving:

Last week the asphalt base lift was installed on Ironton Street, Hugo Street and portions of Ashton Avenue and Ely Street. The final lift will be placed after the entire project area has been paved with the first lift. Paving the first lift on the streets currently being graded is scheduled for the week of September 21<sup>st</sup>. Asphalt driveways that were removed during construction will be paved shortly after. The final lift is scheduled for the beginning of October.

## Select Curb Replacement & Concrete Driveways:

Select curb replacement will continue and the remaining concrete driveways that were removed will be poured toward the end of next week.

## Boulevard Restoration & Irrigation Repair:

The contractor will begin restoring the boulevard areas disturbed during construction near the end of September, prior to paving the final lift. This phase of work involves light grading, irrigation repair, placing topsoil and seeding.

## Resident Access

The City and Contractor will do everything possible to minimize the inconvenience to residents in the construction areas.

However, please note that this type of construction may generate noise, dust, and mud, and is generally a disruption to the area.

Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street.

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone.

Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.
