



2019 Street Rehabilitation Project

Construction Update
September 11, 2020

Street Reclamation:

The Contractor will begin street reclamation on the project streets **Monday, September 14th**. These include 69th Avenue and University Avenue East Service Road. Street reclamation grinds the first 8"-10" of the existing roadway into a suitable aggregate base for the new pavement. The Contractor will immediately follow the street reclamation with grading to prepare the base and provide a drivable surface. After the Contractor has reclaimed the roadway, there will be a portion of time that the roadway will be a gravel street. The Contractor will have the street graded down so that the street is drivable and safe. We will make sure that the Contractor keeps putting water down to keep the dust to a minimum. The Contractor must keep the streets open for emergency vehicles.

Trail Work Continued:

The contractor will continue to work on the construction of the new trail in front of the Civic Campus on the west side of the Service Road from 69th Avenue to 73rd Avenue.

The City will send additional notices as the work commences. Residents can anticipate a weekly update during construction, typically posted on Fridays. Note work will be phased by the contractor, with substantial completion by the end of October.

Resident Access

Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street. The City and Contractor will collaborate in minimizing the inconvenience to residents during construction. Please keep in mind that this type of construction may generate noise, dust and mud. Generally, it can be a disruption to the neighborhood, but we are working together toward a common goal.

Worksite Safety

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone. Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.

The contractor's hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday – Friday. There is potential for occasional work on Saturdays upon City approval.
