



# 2019 Street Rehabilitation Project

Construction Update  
September 18, 2020

## Concrete Sidewalk and Curb & Gutter:

The Contractor will begin pouring concrete curb & gutter around the project area on **Monday, September 21<sup>st</sup>**. The contractor will also be pouring the concrete for the sidewalk on the south side of 71<sup>st</sup> Avenue from University Avenue East Service Road towards the east. In order for the new concrete to strengthen and cure properly, it requires 7 days of undisturbed curing. We ask that during this time to avoid driving, biking or walking on the new concrete. The concrete valley gutter will also be poured on the south side of 69<sup>th</sup> Avenue at Rice Creek Blvd West intersection. Residents will be able to access 69<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Rice Creek Blvd East while the concrete cures.

## Street Grading:

The Contractor will continue grading University Avenue East Service Road and 69<sup>th</sup> Avenue in preparation for paving.

## Street Grading:

Paving the asphalt base lift on University Avenue East Service Road and 69<sup>th</sup> Avenue is tentatively scheduled for the end of the week of September 21<sup>st</sup>.

## Trail Work Continued:

The contractor will continue to work on the construction of the new trail in front of the Civic Campus on the west side of the Service Road from 69<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 73<sup>rd</sup> Avenue.

Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street. The City and Contractor will collaborate in minimizing the inconvenience to residents during construction. Please keep in mind that this type of construction may generate noise, dust and mud. Generally, it can be a disruption to the neighborhood, but we are working together toward a common goal.

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone. Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.
