



2019 Street Rehabilitation Project

Construction Update

October 2, 2020

Raising Iron:

On Tuesday, October 6th, the contractor will cut the pavement that was paved this week and raise the manholes and water valves to their final elevation in preparation for the final lift of asphalt. The manholes are left under the surface of the street and plated over with steel so that the contractor can get proper compaction on the base layers. It also ensures that the manholes are set to the correct final elevation.

Boulevard Restoration & Irrigation Repair:

The contractor will continue to restore the areas disturbed during construction. The contractor plans to start seeding the disturbed areas midweek the week of October 5th. This phase of work involves light grading, irrigation repair, placing topsoil and seeding.

Milling (Remove 2 inches of pavement) on 71st Avenue :

On Friday, October 9th, the contractor will be milling 2 inches off the existing roadway section on 71st Avenue from University Avenue East Service Road to Locke Parkway.

Street Paving:

Saturday, October 10th, the Contractor will be paving the asphalt final lift for University Avenue East Service Road, 69th Avenue and 71st Avenue.

Resident Access

Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street. The City and Contractor will collaborate in minimizing the inconvenience to residents during construction. Please keep in mind that this type of construction may generate noise, dust and mud. Generally, it can be a disruption to the neighborhood, but we are working together toward a common goal.

Worksite Safety

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone. Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.
