



2020 Street Rehabilitation Project

Final Street Paving (Tuesday 10/6), Etc.

October 5, 2020

Street Paving & Parking:

Tuesday, October 6th, the Contractor will install the final lift of pavement throughout the entire project area. Two crews will be working in tandem to complete paving in one day. Crews will begin on **Ely Street**, followed by **Ruth Street, Liberty Street, Longfellow Street and 79th Avenue**. Following completion of the streets above, it's anticipated that **Ashton Avenue** will be paved from south to north, with **Ironton Street** and **Hugo Street** closing out the day.

We ask that you please stay off the new pavement for as long as possible. This allows for the asphalt to cure and will produce the best final product. We ask residents to avoid active paving areas when leaving the neighborhood. Please allow for a few extra minutes in your day if re-routing is necessary to exit the neighborhood. We appreciate your patience as we near completion of the project.

As a reminder, we ask that no vehicles or property be parked on project area streets during working hours (7am-7pm Mon-Fri). This gives the Contractor room to work and prevents any damage to personal property. In general, the Contractor will accommodate residential and business traffic during paving operations.

Boulevard Restoration:

The City encourages residents to water their newly restored lawn when necessary to ensure healthy re-establishment. As a general rule, the green stabilizing mulch should be kept moist. Any areas that were missed during initial restoration will be added to a punch list and restored during close out of the project.

Resident Access

The City and Contractor will do everything possible to minimize the inconvenience to residents in the construction areas.

However, please note that this type of construction may generate noise, dust, and mud, and is generally a disruption to the area.

Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street.

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone.

Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.
