



Fridley has two fire stations:

Station 1 is located at 60th and University Ave. and is staffed 24 hours a day. This is the station that is connected to City Hall.

Station 2 is located at 6381 Central Ave. Fridley Fire provides fire suppression, emergency medical and hazardous materials response services.

Neighborhood Resource Officers

Winter Parking & Snow Removal

Our plows at work for you!

The City of Fridley plows 107 miles of city roads, 80 cul-de-sacs, 18 alleys and dead-ends, 17 parking lots and 12 miles of sidewalks.

Winter Parking Rule November 1 - April 1

No parking on Fridley streets between 2 a.m. - 6 a.m. and whenever snow removal is in progress.

Vehicles parked on the street during these times may be tagged and towed at owner's expense.



Safety First!

Minnesota winters are sometimes brutal and unpredictable. There will be big trucks coming through your neighborhood, often during poor weather with slippery conditions and limited visibility. Always remember these helpful tips:

- Keep children safe. No snow forts or snow sculptures close to the street. Those big snow drifts at the curb are tempting, but plows cannot stop as quickly as cars, need more room to turn and create limited sight lines.
- Reduce your speed around plows and keep your distance whether on foot or in a vehicle.
- On garbage pick-up days, keep garbage cans in the end of your driveway and out of the street or sidewalk. The same applies to recycling containers, shovels, toys, etc.

We need your help so we can clear roads as quickly and safely as possible!

New to Minnesota?

Temperatures regularly fall below freezing and have dropped as low as -60° F. Visit our website for tips on being prepared for winter!

Winter Reminder

It is unlawful to push, shovel or blow snow onto or across city streets and boulevards or onto other property. Penalties increase with each offense - up to 90 days in jail or a \$700 fine. Property owners are responsible for their own actions and those of their contracted snow removers.



Utilities, Recycling, Garbage & More

In Fridley, residential garbage collection is required and arranged directly with your choice of licensed waste haulers (listed below). Please contact them for rates and service agreements.

Curbside recycling is provided citywide through Republic Services and is billed in conjunction with your city water/sewer bill. Fridley recycling has a low quarterly rate because all residents participate equally. Recycling is tax-free, compared to a state tax of 9.75 percent on garbage, so you can save money by recycling more!

Recycling is picked up every other week on the same day as your garbage collection. Find your recycling day online at FridleyMN.gov/Welcome or call 763-572-3594.
