



Street Rehabilitation Project No. ST2026-01

Project Update
September 17th, 2026

This week, the Contractor began boulevard restoration behind the newly installed curb & gutter and the adjustment of existing surface utilities within the roadway. Next week, the Contractor will continue boulevard restoration, including seeding and irrigation repairs, as well as surface utility adjustments in preparation for upcoming paving.

Boulevard Restoration Care:

Following the completion of boulevard restoration, the Contractor will be responsible for the maintenance and establishment of new grass for a period of 45 days. Following this maintenance period and acceptance by the City, the future health and maintenance of the grass will be the property owner's responsibility.

Street Parking:

On-street parking in areas of active construction will be restricted, unless otherwise noted, during working hours (7:00 am – 7:00 pm, Mon - Fri). Vehicles parked within the immediate work area during certain phases of construction may be subject to towing.

Please note that all construction scheduling is tentative, weather-dependent, and subject to change.

Construction

Once construction begins, the Contractor's hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday-Friday. Occasional work outside of these hours may occur with City approval.

Please keep in mind that this type of construction may generate noise, dust, mud, and be disruptive to the area. Please be patient with the Contractor and contact us with any concerns.

Resident Access

During construction, the City and contractor will work to minimize inconvenience to residents. That said, residents can anticipate occasional impacts to utility services and driveway access during various phases of construction. Generally, impacts to utility services are limited to short durations (hours) while driveway access may be impacted for up to 7 days during concrete work. Properties impacted by construction activity shall receive advanced written notice of such work.

Restoration Care Guide

Restoration Care Guide:

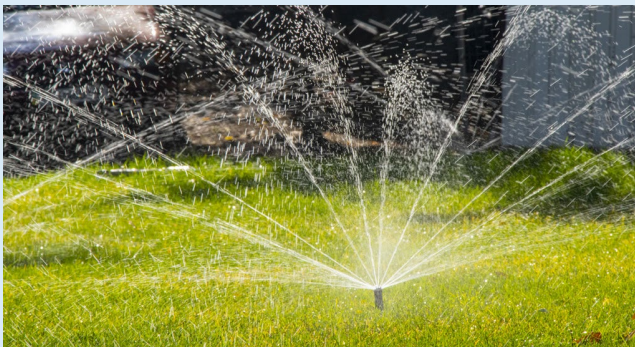
The Contractor has recently completed the restoration of boulevard disturbed by construction activity. Disturbed green space has been restored with topsoil, fertilizer, seed, hydraulic fiber matrix and erosion prevention measures, if required. The information below outlines the responsibilities of the Contractor and property owner as well as best practices you can take to promote healthy establishment of your new grass.

The Contractor is responsible for maintaining the newly restored boulevard for the first forty-five (45) days after installation. After the 45-day maintenance period, restored areas will be inspected by the City for acceptance or correction by the Contractor. Once accepted by the City, ownership and maintenance of restored areas is turned over to the property owner. The City or Contractor will not replace grass that dies or deteriorates after the 45-day maintenance period and initial acceptance by the City. The future health of the grass is the property owner's responsibility.

Contractor's Responsibility During the 45-Day Maintenance Period

Watering

- The Contractor is responsible for watering restored areas for the 45-day maintenance period; however, property owners are encouraged to support the establishment of new grass by watering as well.
- During the first week after seeding, the soil should be watered lightly 2-3 times per day as needed to keep soil moist.
- After the first week, continue to water seedlings as needed to keep the soil moist. Generally apply water at a rate of 1/3", three times per week.
- Watering early in the day is best as less water is lost to evaporation and more is absorbed into the soil.



Mowing

- It is recommended that property owners do not mow newly established grass until after the 45-day maintenance period.

Property Owner's Responsibility After the 45-Day Maintenance Period

Watering

- Continue to water at a rate of 1/3", three times per week, applying early in the day.

Mowing

- Mow when turf first reaches uniform height of 5"-6". Do not mow when the density is less than 50 percent of area coverage.
- Do not mow newly established turf when conditions are hot (85°F) and dry.
- Do not cut more than 1/3 of the grass height in a single mowing event.
- If walking in the new grass area shows settlement in the soil, the turf has not yet established and should not be mowed. Do not mow if mower tires form ruts.
- Turf takes up to 1 year to fully establish from seed.
